## Central Lancashire Core Strategy Consultation

The Parish Council visited the exhibition at PGRFC and has responded (on website) The consultation document set out the Visions & Objective for the Central Lancashire area, our communities specific set of Visions & Objective was adopted in the Broughton Neighbourhood Development Plan (adopted 12/2018) which needs to be taken into account when this strategy is finalised. The BNDP is the only plan adopted in the CLSC area that is for a rural village, the other two are for an urban area (Inner East Preston adopted 2016) and a town (Penwortham adopted 07/2018). The "call for sites" acknowledged the request for "protected status" for the proposed Areas of Separation between Broughton/Barton/Haighton & Whittingham, however these were NOT on display at the exhibition. The site put forward will be considered in September when the review of allocated sites and policy updates to reflect the 2018 NPPF are considered and consulted on.

## Community Meeting Rooms & café

The preparations for the Toll Bar Cottage works continue. The plans were passed with one condition about the landscaping and planting of the outside areas. Detailed plans for this were submitted to the city council and were accepted. External work that was required to mitigate any further deterioration has been completed with the roof repaired, chimney stabilized and the gutters sorted, hence the scaffolding.

The structural engineer has completed his work alongside the ground investigating for the extension. These will soon be with the architect who will finish the specification and agree them with the Building Inspector. As soon as they are ready they will be posted on the governments "contracts finder" website for contractors to submit their tenders...so by the end of March we hope to have the work started...and the café open in the summer....



The outcome of the various grant applications to help with the work are due in March....
