#### **Community Infrastructure Levy Celebration**

The 2 main projects this year have been:-Promoting and preserving Broughton's heritage

The new seating area behind the pinfold is now finished. We were lucky to have such a skilled craftsman a Tom Swindhoe for the work. The Pinfold has been cleaned, the steps made easier and the paving behind re-laid. The 1<sup>st</sup> of the 3 heritage plaques is in place there telling the tale of the Pinfold on a drystone plinth.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> plaque is on the Garstang road near the church hamlet and the 3<sup>rd</sup> one on the King Georges field.

If you want to know more about the heritage and people of Broughton the walk leaflets will be available in November and there are two more villages walks dates this year. They then stop until the spring. Groups may book a walk with donations to the Cottage renovation. This Project was jointly funded by CiL & Enviro, thanks also go to the neighbors who have kept Tom supplied with brews Community Hub

The Parish Council has completed the purchase of the Toll Bar Cottage and the plans have been prepared for a café and meetings rooms to be housed in the Cottage and a side extension. The application for change of use and the works are with Preston City Council Planning department and we hope to have a positive result by December.

We have had a very positive meeting specifically with those neighbours living close by the Cottage where they had an opportunity to view the plans and discuss them with the Cllrs. The architect is now drawing up the specifications for the next stage when the sub-group will be looking for contractors which we hope to find locally. The work will be done in phases over the next 6-9

One of the 2 conifers at the gates to the Cottage is to become the permanent village Christmas tree.

The "Community Grants Scheme" has continued with partial support for the Primary school library which will be open to the community and the Community defibrillator.

#### **Open access Community Defibrillator**

The public access defibrillator funded jointly by the Broughton Club and a CiL grant from Broughton Parish Council has now been installed on the outside of the Concert Hall at the Broughton Club on Whittingham Lane.

The defibrillator has been added to the emergency response computer which means that when 999 is dialed the operator will after ascertaining that it is needed give a code to release it to the public. The defibrillator <u>can be operated by anyone</u> as it tells/instructs the user in its use, however training sessions are being arranged to support its use and teach what to do in a health emergency.

# 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Parish Council

On the 4<sup>th</sup> December 1894 the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Parish council with 45 local people present was held. The meeting appointed David Ashworth chairman (he does not seem to have been elected) and then those present voted from 7 nominees for the 1<sup>st</sup> council with G Hotherstall, J Myerscough, R Hardman G Duckworth, Jos Brown duly elected.

Reading the minutes lead to fascinating insights such as the employment of a Village Mole catcher, over 25 years of discussion over the linking of Broughton to mains sewage. This issue and many others were made worse due to the strange arrangement of the Preston town council and Preston rural district council being separated by the Fulwood Urban district council. The 1<sup>st</sup> female councilor was not elected until the mid-1960.

The full records of the Parish council are held at the Lancashire archives and make fascinating reading.
