Broughton Neighbourhood Development Plan

The changes needed to update the plan are not considered to be "minor", especially policy RES1. The policy is to be redrafted and a "Settlement Boundary" policy inserted. A flood risk map and an updated Parish Action Plan will be appendices to the revised plan. We are advised by PCC that this will not require a referendum but will need to go to be "consulted" on and examined. The next full review will be in 2023 when the current plan will be aligned to the new Planning Act expected in 2021.

Parish Action Plan update and key issues Village traffic

The PC has written to LCC with suggestions and ideas to try to mitigate the problem after discussion with the traffic police. This has not met with any success to date. The PC is looking at ways that it can directly help to reduce this problem. The key issues being speeding and the crossroads where we want a STOP sign. You can help by contacting LCC or the Police.

Public Transport

The section 106 agreements with the developers as well as getting a contribution to school places had a contribution to bus services.....The PC is asking where this money is being spent.

Footpaths & PROW

LCC footpaths has had the PC report on the state of the PROW the broken stiles, slippy decking and actual blockages, they are working on theses. The lack of signs on some footpaths have as yet not been addressed.

Broadband speed: Is your speed slow? Sign up for the community broadband scheme and we will see whether collectively we can sort this

Toll Bar Cottage: Community Café and meetings rooms

The work started on the Cottage in August with a group of socially distanced volunteers clearing the garden. The contractor, Vista Developments Ltd, form Penwortham has been onsite since mid-September and good progress has been made with the demolition of the garage and outside toilet. Internally the kitchen & bathroom have been stripped and the floor removed to allow the replacement of the beam. The fireplace for the 2nd chimney has been uncovered alongside some old beams. The foundations for the extension and the piling are the next task. If all goes to plan the café will open subject to the covid-19 regulations at the time at Easter 2021.

The **Christmas Tree** will be lit up this year. There will be a switch on but no choir or brew-time, instead we will be hosting a virtual event online by Zoom.....
