Welcome to Broughton Parish

Broughton is a rural parish in the north of Preston. Historically Broughton stretched down to Black Bull Lane but now we finish at the Cricket club. Broughton civil parish does not reflect the parish church ecclesiastical boundaries as these still continue down the A6 but finish at the four ways junction.

A Parish council is the third tier of the local government with Preston City Council (Cllrs Cartwright & Wollam) and Lancashire County Council (Cllr Wilkinson) being the other two layers. We are in the North Preston & Wyre constituency with Ben Wallace as our MP.

Parish councils set a precept which is part of the council tax, this pays for village amenities and local management of things like footpaths and grass cutting.

Village amenities

Broughton has a thriving sports and social club with bowls, bridge, petanque, tennis, drama and snooker. This is a membership club www.broughtonanddistrictclub.co.uk

Fulwood & Broughton Cricket Club is at the southern end of the parish, it has youth and adult teams and is developing a 2nd pitch. http://fbcc.intheteam.com

Broughton is fortunate in having several footpaths and the northern section of the Guild Wheel which will be made a lot safer with the cycle ways along the Garstang Road and the rerouting along Durton Lane once the Bypass is completed.

Neighbourhood Plan Progress

Broughton Parish Council consulted with the Village on its future development in 2016, the plan is currently (July 2017) with the Independent Examiner and will hopefully go to referendum in the autumn.



Buses

Stagecoach bus routes run south/north through the Village hourly no 40 & 41 serving the Garstang Road to and from Preston, Garstang and Lancaster as well as the hospital and Preston College. The number 4 serves the east west route from Longridge to Preston this is a less frequent service. https://www.stagecoachbus.com/

Preston Bus does not work within the parish, the nearest stops are south of Lightfoot Lane on the Garstang Road. As yet there are no services for the Eastway/Durton developments currently but once the Park & Ride is in place others are planned www.prestonbus.co.uk

Churches

St John Baptist Church of England is the parish church, its setting by Blundel Brook in the south of the parish reflects its long history as a place of worship for over 500 years broughtonparish.org.uk.

St Mary's Fernyhalgh Roman Catholic is in the south east of the parish over the M6 Motorway Bridge, this ancient church building is linked to the Ladyewell shrine further down Fernyhalgh Lane. ladyewellshrine.co.uk

Schools, Preschools and nurseries

Broughton is in the enviable position of having one of the best High Schools in the county within its boundaries as well as a primary school with nursery (3+), a preschool (2+) and a nursery. Broughton is within three C of E parochial parishes; to the south of Four Lane Ends you are within Broughton, to the north of the junction you are in Barton and to the east Woodplumpton. The nearest RC primary school is St Mary & St Andrew to the north off Garstang Road on Station Lane.
