## Parish Action Plan (PAP)

The PAP has now been updated and is on the website. The "projects" referred to relate to work that the Parish Council is progressing over 2018-2020.

- > 1 Improve the drainage of the King George V Field
- 2 KGV Park refurbishment
- > 3 Environmental work in KGV area
- > 4 Protecting & explaining Broughton's Heritage

#### Future areas of work

- > Improve and increase Village footpaths
- Support Brown-signs for assets
- Work with developers towards public use of the Eastway "toad" reserve and open area
- Work with businesses to improve their profile and manage events
- > Look at the possibility of a community room or rooms

#### Crossroads and Garstang Road works

Representatives of the Parish council met with Cllr Iddon and LCC officers to discuss the issues raised by the community at the Village Information Session and directly to the council.

<u>Crossroads</u> there are 33 incidents with 18 reported to the police. It was agreed that the request for the traffic lights to be turned on or for a stop sign is not the solution. A valued engineering exercise has looked at this junction and felt the signage was appropriate. The road works post bypass will eventually reduce these issues by slowing traffic, by narrowing the carriageway and the various raised surfaces along the route. There are lot of trucks using the road as a

through route although signage shows this is prohibited and cars using this as a supposed short cut. It was agreed that the through route should only be for buses. Equipment would be installed to record traffic entering or leaving the Garstang Road through Broughton. Traffic that had used this as a through route or trucks not delivering to the Village businesses would then be fined. Buses would not be affected or people turning off or on Garstang Road. It was agreed that this wodul initially would be installed for 6 months with a view to making it permanent.

<u>Speed limits</u> of 20mph cannot be enforced; they are designed to work with the reduced highways widths post road work and roads surfaces.

<u>Proposed timeline for road works:</u> April 2018procurement, June2018 work commences completion by early 2019. Phasing will be south to north, cycle ways and finally the crossroads (the granite for the crossroads is usually sourced from the Far East) There will be disruption to traffic for this period of time. <u>Whittingham Lane speed limits</u> the issues rose by residents of the cottages near to the road and in the 30 mph section were discussed and it was agreed to review this once the traffic measures are in place following the road works.

<u>Motorway junction instances of traffic building up at the roundabout and trailing back to the Durton</u> Lane junction and up the Garstang Road were less frequent that when the bypass was first opened. However it was agreed that the phasing of the roundabout lights would be reviewed as the bypass has now been open for 6 months.

#### Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Neighbourhood Plan completed its Rule 14 consultation on the 21<sup>st</sup> February. The steering group met on the 27<sup>th</sup> February to consider the representations made and to endorse the final version. This was agreed and passed to the Parish Council to endorse the same evening.

The plan and associated documents were passed to Preston City Council and added to the parish council website. If you want to see hard copies of these documents please contact the Clerk. The consultation runs from 7<sup>th</sup> March until 5pm on the 18<sup>th</sup> April, after which it will go back to the Inspector

#### Village Information Event feedback

Considering the abysmal weather of freezing temperatures, rain and gales there was a really good turnout. After the presentation (available on the website) there was an opportunity to question the Parish Council with key points raised were what were the timescales for the Neighbourhood Plan, various traffic issues including the cross roads, the plans for the village & the impact of the planning appeal on the NP policies going forward.
