They are Cllr Pat Hastings (chair), Cllr Leila Eccles (vice-chair), Cllr Joe Hamilton (finance chair), Cllr Lynda Oldcorn, Cllr Nigel Parkinson, and Cllr Les Brown & Cllr Sargeant

At the same election two new and one existing City Cllrs were elected for our ward Rural east. They are Cllr Ron Woolen, Cllr Ian Donnell & Cllr Martin Landless; All the Cllrs have email addresses which are available on the website.

Village Realm Works

There have been some issues caused by the rain but it is hoped the work will be completed by July 15th. The flower beds and trees are all now planted, plus the new bus shelters, bench and the parking bays all place.

Community Hub

One of the key issues of the consultations for the Neighbourhood Plan and Village Information sessions feedback is the lack of a community meeting place in the Village. After looking at and having surveys done on several properties we can report that the Toll Bar Cottage is being purchased by the Parish Council for conversion to a Community Hub.

Detailed plans are being prepared by an architect for Submission to PCC planning in August. With a view to opening early next year. The Hub will retain as many heritage features as possible but will offer meeting spaces, internet access and a place to enjoy a tea/coffee with friends and family.

There is an opportunity at the beginning of the meeting to rise Issues with the Parish Councilors.


Drystone Walling
